Examples of extenuating circumstances include:

☐ Leave of Absence (indicate last semester of enrollment)
☐ FAFSA Applications submitted with incorrect personal information which prevented processing ☐ Other
If your appeal is approved, it will be a one-time exception and based on the date you submitted your FAFSA, you may receive a reduction in aid. Appeals will not be reviewed if your FAFSA is not yet submitted.
