Main Hall is the Regis icon, the centerpiece of the University's history that evokes nostalgia from all who have been touched by the Regis experience. Today, it continues to play an essential role in University life, housing the Office of the President, Regis College Business faculty, Registrar, Financial Aid, Fine Arts and Music, and student classrooms.

From the legend that the greater part of the building was completed in 98 days, to the loveable moniker "The Pink Palace," to the memorable visit by Pope John Paul II with Main Hall as the backdrop, this historic building has stood as the landmark for decades.

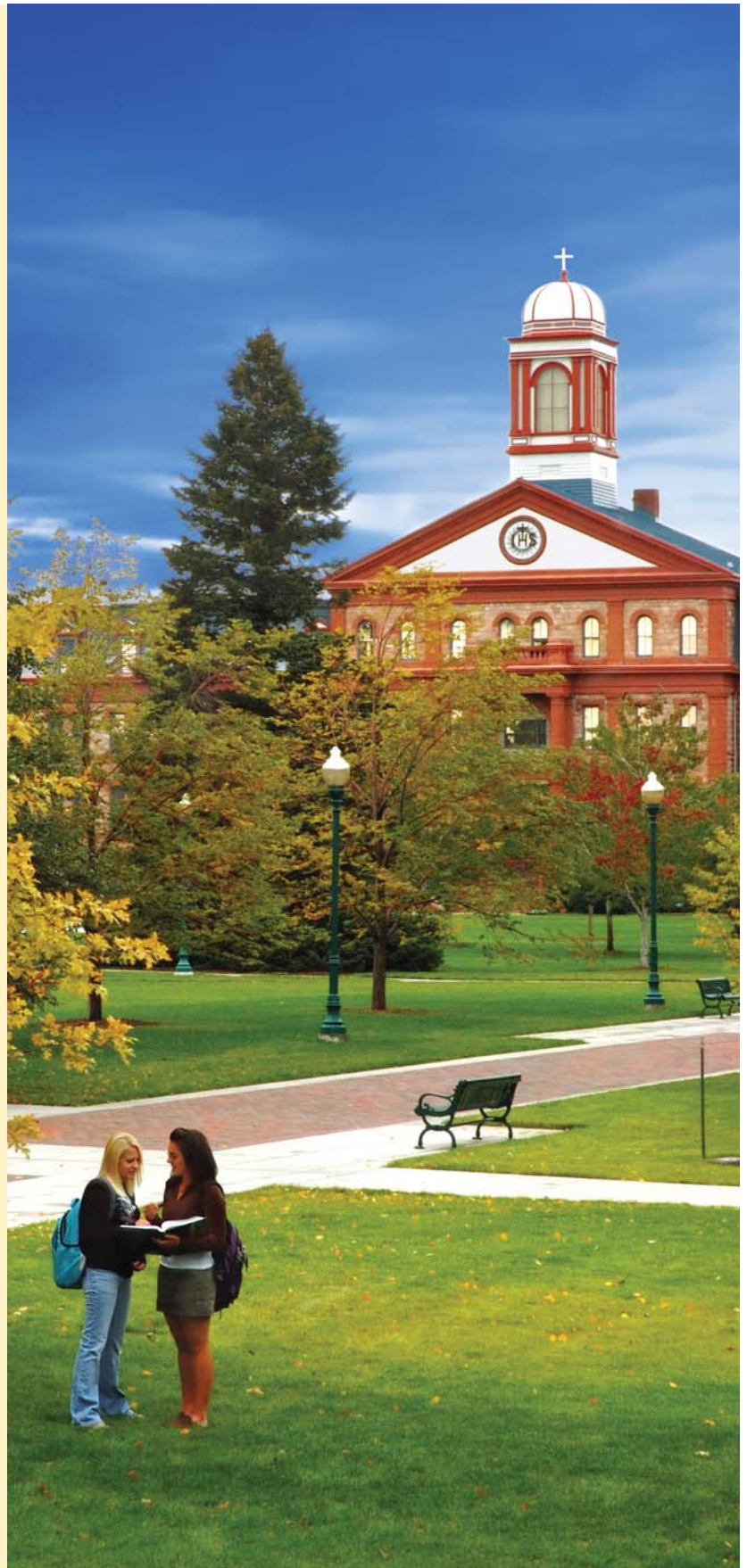
In his history of Regis on the Crest of the West, Reverend Harold L. Stansell, S.J., notes that "The building was an imposing one for those times. Situated on the crest of the hill and crowned with a cupola, it commanded a panoramic view of the Front Range of the Rocky Mountains, the Clear Creek Valley, and Denver."

Recognizing the key role that heritage and tradition play in the success and longevity of any educational institution, Regis desires to renovate and continue restoring its landmark building.

"The Campaign for Regis University, Writing the Next Chapter" renovated the top two floors of the building which have been out of use for 20 years, removed the additions made in the early and mid 1900s, and restored the building's exterior, including the installation of the cupola.

There are still many projects to be done to complete Main Hall's restoration. Items that still need funding include installation of new windows and replacement of the mansard and roof.

Restoration of Main Hall preserves the icon that symbolizes the heritage and tradition that is at the heart of Regis University's remarkable growth
