Following an evaluation by an independent review panel the Information Assurance (IA) curriculum at the School of Computer and Information Sciences has been recertified by the Committee on National Security Systems (CNSS). This courseware certification will be valid through June 2014 and serves as a testament of the continuing excellence of our IA curriculum. Regis University will receive an official certificate, signed by the CNSS Chair, during the Awards Ceremony Dinner, at the 13th Colloquium for Information Systems Security Education (CISSE) to be held in Seattle, Washington in June 2009.

The Committee on National Security Systems (CNSS) provides a forum for the discussion of policy issues, sets national policy, and promulgates direction, operational procedures, and guidance for the security of national security systems. National security systems are information systems operated by the U.S. Government, its contractors or agents that contain classified information.
