6. Availability of Instructional Resources and Information Technology

Information Technology Services is dedicated to supporting learning at Regis University by providing:

- “State of the practice” presentation technology for 100% of the Lowell Campus classrooms. Extension campus classrooms are at about 65% overall, with another 17 mobile units to cover those rooms not outfitted with presentation technology.
- 13 internet kiosks located in the Ranger Grille, Carroll Hall, and Main Hall on the Lowell campus; kiosks are also located at the Broomfield, Denver Tech, and Colorado Springs locations.
- Computer labs in Dayton Memorial Library (DML), Adult Learning Center, Carroll Hall, Science Building, and all residence halls on the Lowell Campus. Most study desks in DML have network jacks for hardwired RegisNET access and power outlets for laptops. Computers on the second floor provide access to the internet, library resources, and Microsoft Office productivity software, while computers on the first, third, and fourth floors also have specialized programs for the three colleges of Regis University.
- Four public computers and hardwired network jacks for personal laptops in the Colorado Springs branch library.
- Wireless “hot spots” allowing students at both DML and the Colorado Springs branch library to use their own laptops to connect to networked resources with a RegisNET account.
- Support for the Center for Academic Technology (CAT) lab which is a combination lab, IT library and meeting room with the focus on supporting faculty in the effective use of technology in the classroom.
- Networked projectors in classrooms.
- Telephones near every podium for immediate connection to the ITS Helpdesk.
- An ITS staff person who checks all Lowell campus classroom technology daily at 5:00 a.m.
- Helpdesk assistance from 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. on weekdays, 8:00 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. on Saturdays, and 10:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. on Sundays.
- Online self-help database in the areas of Technology on Campus, Online Systems, Online Learning, Hardware, Software, and University Technology Services.
- High-end technology in the renovated Science Building classrooms and auditorium
- “Adobe Connect” for videoconferencing.
- Wireless coverage in all classrooms, conference rooms, residential rooms, and most internal public spaces. We have purchased hardware to provide outdoor wireless service in some locations during spring 2008.

ITS uses a variety of network and systems monitoring applications and tools to monitor traffic over the network for security and licensing issues. Trending is also done with a variety of applications, and network and systems adjustments are made according to trend analysis. The University employs a number of network firewalls, and RegisNET is extensively subnetted for efficiency and security purposes. Firewall and antivirus software is installed on each desktop computer. Antivirus software is free for all current residents of Lowell Campus residence halls. Non-academic Internet use, such as for games and other legal uses, is often “shaped” to reserve bandwidth for primary, academic purposes. When secondary uses of the Internet are deemed potentially illegal, such as with many of the Peer-to-Peer (PTP) file-sharing applications, those uses are blocked altogether.
