

## Articles

The following library databases can be used to find scholarly and professional articles on issues related to business law. From the library web page, <http://www.regis.edu/library>, follow the [A-Z Database List](#) in the [Library Quick Links](#).

**LegalTrac:** Indexes and abstracts all major law reviews, legal newspapers, law specialty publications, bar association journals, and international legal journals. Law-related articles from almost 1000 business and general interest titles are also indexed. Full text articles from over 100 journals are also included.

**Business Source Premier:** Full text articles from over 7,400 journals and other sources in management, economics, finance, accounting, and international business, including the Harvard Business Review. Includes peer-reviewed (1,000+) and general business magazines (1,200+), country economic reports, industry yearbooks and market research reports.

## Legislation

The following databases can be used to access the full text of state and federal legislation, reports, codes, and other government publications.

**Colorado Revised Statutes:** A searchable version of the latest edition of the Colorado Revised Statutes. Use the menu on the left hand side to browse the Colorado state constitution, court rules, and statutes. The database also offers access to the U.S. constitution.

**CQ Supreme Court Collection:** Includes historical analysis with updates and expert commentary of Supreme Court decisions, biographies of Supreme Court justices, Supreme Court institutional history, and the U.S. Constitution. Users can access information by topic, justice, and case name.

**GPO Access:** <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/> The official web site of the U.S. government Printing Office. The site provides access to publications from the legislative, executive, and judicial branches.

**LexisNexis Academic:** This collection of resources covers five areas: news, business, legal research, medical, and reference. The legal research collection provides access to legal news, law reviews, federal and state case law, federal code & regulations, state codes, tax law, patents, and more.

**LexisNexis Congressional:** A comprehensive source for U.S. legislative information. Use the menu on the left hand side to search within congressional publications, legislative histories, bills & laws, members & committees, regulations, the congressional record & rules, and political news.

## Examples

### How can I find journal articles on sexual harassment?

1. Go to the *LegalTrac* database
2. Enter the phrase “sexual harassment” in the first search box
3. Click the Search button.

### How do I find case studies or reports on workers’ compensation?

1. Go to the *Business Source Premier* database
2. Enter the term “workers compensation” in the Find box
3. In the “Document Type” menu in the lower half of the screen, select “Case Study” and “Reports” (hold the CTRL key down to select both).
4. Click the Search button.

### How can I find federal bankruptcy law(s)?

1. Go to the *LexisNexis Academic* database
2. Click the Legal tab at the top of the screen.
3. On the right side of the screen, click on Federal and State Codes
4. Enter the term “bankruptcy” in the search box
5. Click the Search button.

### How can I find the following court case: McDonnell Douglas Corp. v. Green 411 U.S. 792 (1973)?

1. Go to the *LexisNexis Academic* database
2. Click the Legal tab at the top of the screen.
3. On the right side of the screen, click on Federal and State Cases.
4. Use either the “Case Name” or “Citation Number” search in the bottom half of the screen. The Citation Number search is very particular; use the Citation Help link to view the correct formats.
