

# CREDIT FOR PREVIOUS COURSEWORK

Regis awards credit for non-classroom credit experiences including College Board Advanced Placement (AP), College Level Examination Program (CLEP), Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES) and International Baccalaureate (IB) Program. In addition to non-classroom work, Regis will evaluate coursework completed at a college or university on an individual basis.

## College or University Coursework

Regis will accept any college, university or community college course, from an accredited institution, which is equivalent to a corresponding course at Regis. All courses which have a grade of "C-" or higher will be considered for transfer. Courses with a grade of "P" must be equivalent to a "C" or higher. Technical credits are generally not accepted as transferable and students are encouraged to take baccalaureate-oriented courses. Official transcripts of college level or higher work will be considered.

There is no limit on the number of credits which can be transferred into Regis. However, all students are required to take at least 30 semester hours enrolled at the Regis campus. A minimum of 128 semester hours are needed for graduation; 58 hours in the core, in addition to meeting department graduation requirements.
