## RN to MS, Nursing Program

### Developing Effective Leaders of Change

Few job markets are changing as rapidly as the field of nursing. Nurses must understand technology, take on critical care roles, assist in home care roles – all while remaining aware of societal changes and how they impact the medical environment.

To help RNs advance quickly into leadership and teaching positions that address such community concerns, Regis University offers the RN to MS, Nursing program which awards the Bachelor of Science in Nursing and the Master of Science, Nursing.

Today's NNP plays a critical role in providing health care services to high-risk babies and infants in NICUs, well baby nurseries, and in follow-up clinics. While in the program, you will combine advanced knowledge in nursing theory, health care policy, ethics, and leadership related to the role of the advanced practice nurse with intensive courses reflecting the unique learning needs of the NNP.

Regis University's Doctor of Nursing Practice program is designed to develop the advanced clinical, organizational, economic, and leadership skills that are necessary for today's nurse leader. The DNP graduate will be poised to take a leading role in direct patient care, in the management of care for individuals and communities, in health care policy decision making, and at senior level management within healthcare organizations.

### Scholarship

The student will complete didactic online courses in DNP core and specialty curriculum. All students will complete a scholarly capstone project related to translational research in practice with vulnerable, diverse, or underserved populations in rural or urban settings.

The focus of the student clinical experiences will be on diverse, underserved, and vulnerable populations in urban and rural settings with the goal to improve direct and indirect health care services.

### Mission-Focused

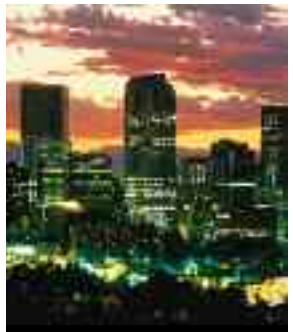
