BEWARE OF FINANCIAL AID FRAUD

According to the FTC, perpetrators of financial aid fraud often use these tactics to manipulate students:

- Guarantee scholarship or your money back
- Promise that you can't get this information anywhere else
- Ask for your credit card or bank account number to hold the scholarship
- Promise to do all the work for you
- Inform you that your scholarship will cost some money
- Congratulate you that you have been selected by a 'national foundation' to receive a scholarship or say that 'You're a finalist' in a contest you never entered

Graduation and Completion Rates

Graduation and Completion rates are available for a cohort of students for whom 150% of the normal time-to-completion has elapsed and are compiled by the Office of Academic Records and Registration and updated by July 1 every year.
