FIRST YEAR PHARMACY STUDENTS – FALL 2009 AND SPRING 2010

Class Status: Undergraduate

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Answer "NO" to Question #50. At the beginning of the 2009-2010 school year, you will NOT be working on a master's or doctorate program.

Financial Aid Dependency Status: Your dependency status depends on how you answer Questions #48-49, #51-#60 on the FAFSA application. If the answer to these questions is NO, you are considered a dependent and your parents may be required to complete their section of the FAFSA.

Financial Aid Eligibility

If you DO NOT have a bachelor's degree, you may be eligible for:

Federal Pell Grant

Academic scholarships and other gift awards if you are a continuing Regis College student

Annual Federal Stafford Loan

Dependent Student: Up to \$5,500 per year in subsidized, \$2,000 unsubsidized

Independent Student: Up to \$5,500 per year in subsidized, \$7,000 unsubsidized

Aggregate Federal Stafford Loan Levels

Dependent Student: \$31,000, of which maximum of \$23,000 in subsidized

Independent Student: \$57,500, of which maximum of \$23,000 in subsidized

Federal PLUS loan - Dependent student's parent may borrow if eligible (cost of education less aid and no adverse credit)

Private Alternative Loans if eligible (cost of education less aid and creditworthy)

If you DO have a bachelor's degree, you may be eligible for:

Annual Federal Stafford Loan

Dependent Student: Up to \$5,500 per year in subsidized, \$2,000 unsubsidized

Independent Student: Up to \$5,500 per year in subsidized, \$7,000 unsubsidized

Undergraduate Aggregate Federal Stafford Loan Levels

Dependent Student: \$31,000, of which maximum of \$23,000 in subsidized

Independent Student: \$57,500, of which maximum of \$23,000 in subsidized

Federal PLUS loan - Dependent student's parent may borrow if eligible (cost of education less aid and no adverse credit)

Private Alternative Loans if eligible (cost of education less aid and creditworthy)

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Financial Aid Dependency Status: You are considered an independent student, and parents are NOT required to complete their section of the FAFSA.

Financial Aid Eligibility

You may be eligible for:

- Academic scholarships (but no other grants) if you are a continuing Regis College student
- Federal Stafford Loan with extended unsubsidized for health professions - up to \$8,500 per year in subsidized, \$24,500 unsubsidized
- Aggregate Federal Stafford Loan - up to \$224,000 of which maximum of \$65,500 in subsidized
- Graduate PLUS Loan if eligibility remains (cost of education less financial aid and no adverse credit)
- Private Alternative Loans if eligible (cost of education less financial aid and creditworthy)

THIRD AND FOURTH YEAR PHARMACY STUDENTS – 2011-2012 AND 2012-2013

Class Status: Graduate

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Answer “YES” to Question #50: At the beginning of the 2011-2012 school year, you will be working on a master’s or doctorate program.

Financial Aid Dependency Status: You are considered an independent student, and parents are NOT required to complete their section of the FAFSA.

Financial Aid Eligibility:

You may be eligible for:

- Federal Stafford Loan with extended unsubsidized for health professions - up to \$8,500 per year in subsidized, \$24,500 unsubsidized
- Aggregate Federal Stafford Loan - up to \$224,000 of which maximum of \$65,500 in subsidized
- Graduate PLUS Loan if eligibility remains (cost of education less financial aid and no adverse credit)
- Private Alternative Loans if eligible (cost of education less financial aid and creditworthy)
