CULMINATING ACADEMIC PROGRAM REVIEW

MAE 699A – Master's Degree Culminating Academic Program (CAP) Review (0 SH)

Candidates register for the Culminating Academic Program (CAP) Review the final semester of their respective program. The review provides a forum for candidates to demonstrate their growth as learners and educators and their ability to meet the program and University standards. The CAP Review serves as a comprehensive examination. Prerequisite: Completion of program coursework. Pass/no pass grading; CAP Review fee.

Candidates register for the Linguistically Diverse Educator (LDE) Culminating Academic Program (CAP) Review the final semester of their endorsement program. The review provides a forum for endorsement candidates to actively demonstrate their growth as learners and educators and their ability to meet the state LDE standards. Prerequisite: Approval of program director. Pass/no pass grading; CAP Review fee.

{ PROGRAM INFORMATION }

NEW STUDENT INFORMATION

To register for classes, new students must submit the application, essay, and application fee. New students continue their application process by submitting their recommendations and transcripts to the MAE office the first semester of their program.

Master's degree courses are open to all licensed teachers. Six semester hours may be taken at the 600 level by an unspecified (non-degree seeking) student before declaring intention for degree candidacy.

CLDE ENDORSEMENT

A Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Education Endorsement is offered through the Master of Arts in Education. A student may earn the endorsement with or without the master's degree. Coursework may be applied to a Master of Arts in Education degree.

NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS

Non-degree seeking students (students who intend to take only one or two courses) must complete an Unspecified Student application. Please contact the MAE office for an application.

REGISTRATION

Students may take no more than two classes during the fall or spring semesters and no more than three classes during the summer semester without approval from the director of the MAE program. This does not include the support seminars.

ATTENDANCE

When you register for a course, it is assumed you will attend all sessions. If a class is missed due to an emergency situation, make-up work is expected, and it is possible an Incomplete grade or lowered grade will be given for the course.

Behavior that reflects respect and genuine caring for peers and instructors is a hallmark of the MAE program. A safe, productive and dynamic learning environment is key to student success. Instructors will discuss guidelines for their individual courses, including the appropriate use of cell phones and laptops during class. Students are asked to make child care arrangements for their children.

ADD/DROP DEADLINES

The add/drop period for each class is through the first business day following the first session of class. Please notify the MAE office prior to the first session of class if you decide to drop the class.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY AND PROCESS

Should you need to withdraw from a course after the add/drop period, you must officially withdraw yourself from the course at Regis University. The MAE office cannot process your withdrawal. The official Withdrawal Form is on WebAdvisor under the Student Menu. Please contact Student Services at 303-458-4126 or student-services@regis.edu for instructions on how to fill out the form. You will need your Regis ID number and the MAE course number, name of the course and section number from which you are withdrawing. You will be billed for pro-rated tuition up to the date your withdrawal form is processed. Notify the MAE office if you plan to withdraw, as this may impact billing for cohort or grant funding.

TUITION

The tuition rate for all 600-level Master of Arts in Education courses for 2014-2015 school year is \$475 per semester hour. A confirmation of registration is emailed with an invoice that lists tuition charges and payment information. A general rule of thumb is tuition is due by the first day of class for variable schedule classes. For semester-long classes (such as seminars and practicum), the tuition due date is set by Regis College (see important dates).

Payment may be made by check or by using a VISA, Master Card or Discover credit card. Once you have set up your RegisNet account, full tuition payments may be made online through WebAdvisor. You may also call the Regis Enrollment Services line, 303-458-4126, to make a credit card payment.

Tuition may also be paid directly to the Regis University Cashier (303-458-4126). Checks should be made payable to Regis University and may be mailed directly to: Regis University, Attn: Cashier, 3333 Regis Blvd, A-8, Denver, CO 80221.

Include course number, title, and student I.D. number on every check and credit card payment.

TUITION DISCOUNT

Teachers not in funded cohorts who submit a current teaching license prior to registration may receive a 10 percent tuition discount. To qualify for this discount submit a copy of your current teaching license to the MAE Office and indicate on your registration that you would like the discount applied. Please note: the discount applies to tuition only—it does not apply to CAP fees, books, etc. This discount may not be applied retroactively.

FINANCIAL AID

The following course load is required for MAE students receiving financial aid: three credit hours per semester is considered half-time; six credit hours per semester is considered full-time.

YOUR REGISNET ACCOUNT

After your application to the Master of Arts in Education Program has been received and reviewed, you will be issued a Student ID and instructions for setting up your RegisNet account. This account allows you to create a Regis email address, access information on WebAdvisor (such as courses, schedules, your tuition account, etc.), and access Desire2Learn (D2L) for online components of blended courses.

Please note: All students are required to obtain a Regis email account. All communication between the University, MAE office, instructors and students will take place using Regis email accounts. You are also requested to obtain a Student ID card and a permit to park on campus. Note that many side streets adjacent to the Regis campus are now restricted to resident parking and non-resident cars will be ticketed and/or towed.

WEBADVISOR

You may review your transcript on WebAdvisor (webadvisor.regis.edu) to be sure you are on track with your credit hours. This is especially important to do with your mentor two semesters prior to your CAP Review so that if you are short in hours, you have time to register for an elective or support seminar. **You may also view your course schedules and location of classes on WebAdvisor.**

ALPHA SIGMA NU

Alpha Sigma Nu is a prestigious Honor Society of Jesuit Universities founded to honor a select group of students each year on the basis of scholarship, loyalty, and service. Students may submit an application after completion of 20 semester hours in the master's program. For Alpha Sigma Nu information, go to Regis.edu or call 303-458-4349.

CAP REVIEW

Students must register for one hour of Support Seminar (695H or 695P) during their CAP Review semester. Candidates who have completed their coursework and are preparing for the CAP Review in fall 2014 must submit their letters of intent to graduate. These letters are due in the MAE office by Aug. 1. The Letter of Intent should include preferred two-week time frames for scheduling the CAP Review, the names of three possible instructors to serve on the review committee and any information that will assist the office in scheduling the CAP Review.

Upon receiving your Letter of Intent, specific information will be sent regarding the CAP Review process, timelines and graduation. Candidates are invited to attend a CAP Preparation meeting at 5 p.m. on Thursday, Aug. 28, Carroll Hall, Room 125, and/or attend a CAP Review of a colleague. All students are invited to attend a CAP Preparation Meeting at any time during the program. Call our office for more information regarding CAP Reviews. A CAP preparation packet is also available from your mentor or through the MAE Office.

CLDE CAP Review

Candidates completing a Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Education (CLDE) endorsement follow the guidelines above.

GRADUATION

Applications for fall 2014 graduates must be submitted online to the Commencement Office by Aug. 1. You must complete a Graduation Application whether or not you plan to commence (walk) at Winter Commencement. To access the application, go to Regis.edu. In the Search bar, type "Graduation" and choose either the Certificate or Graduation form.
