Program Information: The Master of Arts in Counseling: Clinical Mental Health Counseling program is a 60-credit graduate degree offered at Regis University. Courses are offered at the Regis Thornton Campus, Northwest Denver Campus and the Denver Tech Center Campus. Students are admitted to the program 3 times a year for fall, spring and summer admission. Courses are offered in multiple formats to meet the needs of nontraditional students: 14-week semester, 7-week intensive, and weekend intensive formats.

The Master of Arts in Counseling degree is designated by the <u>Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Educational</u> <u>Related Programs (CACREP)</u> as an accredited Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program. The program has accredited by CACREP since 2007, originally as a Community Counseling Program and currently as a Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program. As part of our accreditation requirements, this program outcomes report provides information on the number of graduates for the past academic year, the pass rates on credentialing examinations, and job placement rates (CACREP 2016, Standard 4.E)

Graduates from the MAC CMHC program are eligible to apply for licensure in Colorado as <u>Licensed Professional</u> <u>Counselors</u>. As part of the licensure requirements, applicants must pass the National Counselor Exam published by the <u>National Board of Certified Counselors</u>.
