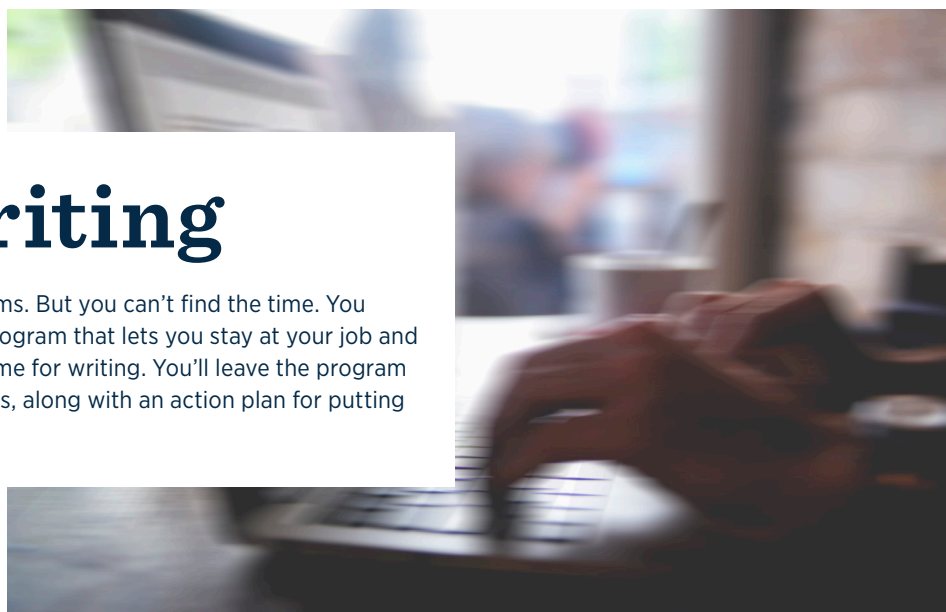


Creative Writing

Twice a year, in January and July, students attend nine-day residencies at our Northwest Denver campus. Residencies are held from Friday evening to the following Sunday afternoon. Each residency includes:

- | Writing workshops
- | Seminars on theory, craft, the study of canonical works and the business of publishing
- | Mentor/student meetings and interviews
- | Evening readings and discussions
- | Visiting writer chats and readings

The fifth residency also features:

- | Readings of students' critical essays
- | Thesis defense
- | Action plans to help students use their writing to contribute to the common good
- | Graduation ceremony
