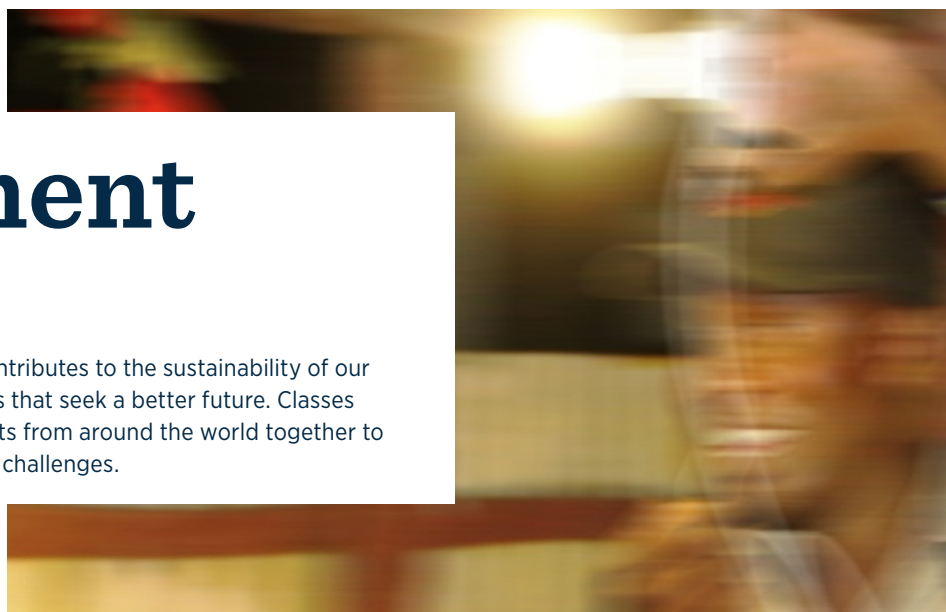


# Development Practice

Achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals by 2030 will demand integrated policy and practice with attention to the lived realities of communities around the world. If you're ready to meet this challenge, the Regis MDP program offers a holistic approach to development practice for those committed to social justice.

## Learn from anywhere in the world.

All Regis MDP courses occur in the Global Classroom at the Posner Center for International Development in Denver, CO. Classes are synchronous and may be attended in person or remotely, from anywhere on earth. Classes are generally held during times that fall outside of sleeping and working hours, no matter where you are.

## You might be wondering:

### IN WHAT FORMAT ARE CLASSES HELD?

Classes are taught in 8-week terms. Students can attend class either in-person in Denver, CO or as part of a live, synchronous online environment from anywhere in the world.

### HOW LONG DOES THE PROGRAM TAKE TO COMPLETE?

This program can be completed in as little as 2-3 years.

### WHEN CAN I START?

The Master of Development Practice program starts once a year in late August.

## Certificate of Development Practice

Complete four foundational seminar courses and select three skills modules from our catalog of interdisciplinary offerings. The Certificate of Development Practice is customizable for students with development experience and may be applied toward the master's degree.

## What you'll need:

### TO APPLY:

- Completed online application
- Official bachelor's degree-bearing transcript(s)
- Resume and essay

If your first/native language is not English, TOEFL or equivalent English language test scores are required.

If your undergraduate degree is from an institution outside of the U.S., a course-by-course International Credential Evaluation is required.

### TUITION AND FEES:

Tuition for the 2020-2021 academic year:

- \$550 per credit hour
- Technology fees: \$62.50 for 3-credit courses, \$21 for 1-credit courses

This requires financial accessibility for students from a wide range of local economies. Regis will work within its available resources to make participation in the program feasible for all qualified students.
