PRE-NURSING REQUIREMENTS

60 credit hours

Students are required to complete all pre-nursing requirements prior to enrolling in major requirements.

Students who complete all pre-nursing requirements outside of Regis submit an application directly to the Traditional BSN program. Students who complete a portion of their pre-nursing requirements at Regis must also submit a separate application to the Traditional BSN program upon completion.
