Regis University's Fellowship combines online orthopaedic management course work, weekend intensive lab sessions held on our beautiful Denver, Colorado campus, online virtual rounds and dynamic mentoring time with a FAAOMPT mentor. Emphasis is placed on advanced clinical decision making, development of manual therapy skills including manipulative interventions, outcomes assessment and autonomous patient management.

You might be wondering:

- IN WHAT FORMAT ARE CLASSES HELD?**
Classes are held online, with four weekend on-campus intensives.
- HOW LONG DOES THE PROGRAM TAKE TO COMPLETE?**
The fellowship can be completed in as little as one year, or up to five years to accommodate your lifestyle.
- WHEN CAN I START?**
Program starts are twice a year in March and August.

TO APPLY:

- | RF-PTCAS application and application fee
- | Official transcripts from every U.S. physical therapy college or university attended
- | Three electronic letters of recommendation. Minimum two references must be professional references
- | Address three essay questions as part of the RF-PTCAS application
- | Resume

All application materials must be submitted through the Residency and Fellowship Physical Therapy Centralized Application Service (RF-PTCAS).

ELIGIBILITY:

- | Evidence of current and valid physical therapy licensure in the United States
- | Applicants must be board certified (OCS preferred) at the time of application. If not OCS, board certification or completion of an ABPTRFE accredited residency in a related area will also be considered

CLINICAL PRACTICE

Students complete a minimum of 850 hours of clinical practice focused on orthopaedic physical therapy during the program. This includes a minimum of 700 hours in virtual rounds, and 150 hours of direct one-on-one clinical practice working with AAOMPT fellows, of which 20 hours occur during the weekend lab sessions on campus.

ON-CAMPUS WEEKEND INTENSIVES

There are four weekend intensives (Fri-Sun) that are associated with each of the four management courses that require attendance on campus at Regis University. One additional trip to campus is required for the final practicum examination. Relocation is not necessary.
