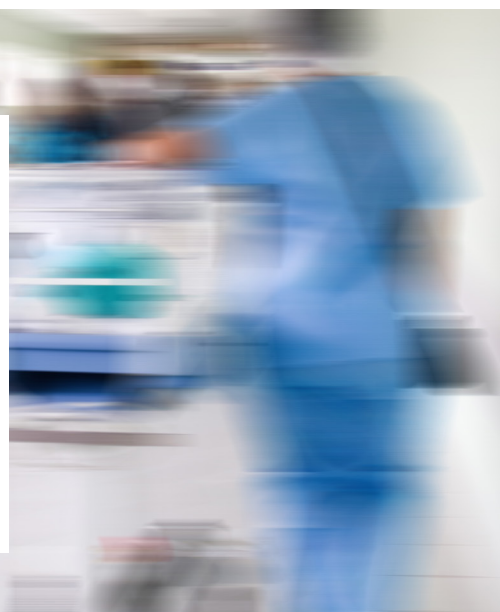

CLINICAL ROTATIONS AND ON-CAMPUS EXPERIENCES

Clinical experiences are covered over 3 semesters. The first rotation is in the second semester of the first year. Clinical experiences are completed in Level III/IV NICUs, with two on-campus intensive simulation and skills experiences.

What You'll Need:

TO APPLY:

- Complete online application through NursingCAS
- Official degree-bearing transcript(s)
- 3 professional letters of recommendation from a supervisor, NNP/Neonatologist and a colleague.
- Resume
- Essay
- Admissions interview may be required

ELIGIBILITY:

- Two years of clinical practice as an RN in a Level III or Level IV NICU
- Nursing bachelor's degree from an NLN or AACN-CCNE accredited program
- Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.75 or above, with a grade of C or better in all nursing courses
- Completion of a statistics course with grade of C or better (must be taken prior to NR 602)
- Active RN license
- Current AHA Basic Life Support (BLS) certification

- Application cycle open: December 1st
- Priority deadline: March 1st
- Final deadline: July 1st
