Integrating the best current research with the dynamic experience of being surrounded with like-minded professionals with a greater purpose, Regis University's Residency in Orthopaedic Physical Therapy allows for rapid post-professional development, advanced clinical decision making, and prepares candidates to sit for the American Board of Physical Therapy Specialties (ABPTS) Orthopaedic Clinical Specialist (OCS) exam.

Residents learn manual therapy techniques such as high velocity low amplitude (HLVA) thrust manipulation and dry needling, as well as joint mobilization, neurodynamic mobilization, muscle energy, soft tissues techniques and exercise prescription.

## You might be wondering:

- IN WHAT FORMAT ARE CLASSES HELD?**  
Classes are held online, with two 1-week lab intensives on our Denver campus.
- HOW LONG DOES THE PROGRAM TAKE TO COMPLETE?**  
During this one-year intensive program, classes are organized in a series of five courses, totaling 12 credit hours delivered over three semesters.
- WHEN CAN I START?**  
Program starts are offered once a year in January.

## What you'll need:

### TO APPLY

- Completed online application
- Three letters of recommendation
- Entry-level DPT degree transcript  
Candidates with a non-PT terminal degree are eligible for entry if they graduated prior to 2017 with a CAPTE-approved terminal education in Physical Therapy
- Physical therapist license verification
- Essay
- Resume/curriculum vitae

### ELIGIBILITY:

- Applicants must have a valid physical therapy licensure in the United States and in the state of practice(s) OR eligible and successfully complete licensure before officially beginning studies for new graduates

### TUITION AND FEES

- 2020-2021 Tuition: \$875 per credit hour

### CLINICAL PRACTICE

Residents will be working full-time while in the residency program as licensed physical therapists. In addition, individual mentoring in orthopaedic physical therapy practice will occur at either the resident's practicing clinic or at a clinical partner site available to the resident. Residents are required to complete 150 hours of 1:1 mentoring.

### SPECIALIZED ACCREDITATION

Regis University Residency in Orthopaedic Physical Therapy is accredited by the American Board of Physical Therapy Residency and Fellowship Education as a post-professional Residency program for physical therapists in Orthopaedics.

The Regis University Residency in Orthopaedic Physical Therapy is not accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE) which accredits entry level physical therapist education and not post-professional programs.
