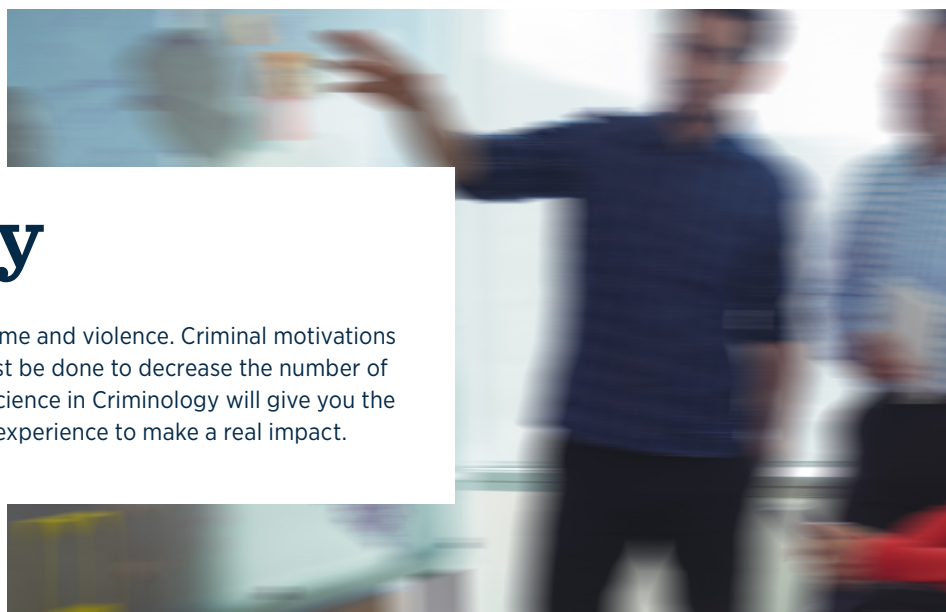


Criminology
