CLINICAL ROTATIONS

Clinical practicums will be completed in your home rural areas with support from local health care facilities and clinics. Clinical placements are secured by students in their community and begin during the fourth semester (second year). Clinical practicums encompass 630 hours divided among pediatric, adult, women's and family health.

Eligibility

- | Must live and work in a qualifying area
- | Nursing bachelor's degree from a NLN or AACN-CCNE accredited program
- | Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.75 or higher, with a grade of "C" or better in all nursing courses
- | Completion of a statistics course with a grade of C or better (must be taken prior to NR 602)
- | Active RN license
- | Current AHA Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- | Two years of clinical practice as an RN (preferred)
