If you hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and feel passionate about caring for the health care needs of families, Regis University's Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program is for you. Learn how to provide primary care nursing across the lifespan looking holistically at the physical, emotional, social and spiritual side of care.

Classes in our traditional pathway are held face-to-face on our Northwest Denver campus. Preparation for national certification is incorporated into the curriculum, with Regis University FNP graduates having one of the highest pass rates in the U.S. A second pathway for students living outside of the Denver metro area is available in a synchronous online format, meaning classes meet in real time while allowing you to attend remotely.

Looking to serve the underserved?

Regis University also offers a remote FNP pathway that focuses on the needs of rural and underserved communities. This low-residency program is offered as a synchronized online learning program, allowing you to be part of a class from a distance. Students living along the front range (Fort Collins to Colorado Springs) must work at Denver Health, Clinica Family Health or Peak Vista Community Health to be eligible for this program.

You might be wondering:

I IN WHAT FORMAT ARE CLASSES HELD?

Classes are taught in a 16-week terms. Classes are held 1x per week from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Students in the Remote FNP pathway are expected to attend the online classroom 1x per week from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

■ WHEN CAN I START?

The on-campus FNP program starts once a year in May. Students in the Remote FNP pathway begin the program in August.

CLINICAL ROTATIONS

Clinical experiences begin during the fourth semester (second year). The clinical experience encompasses 630 hours divided among pediatrics, adult, women's and family situations. The clinical hours are equally distributed across the last three semesters of the program. This ensures the opportunity to consolidate skills and apply theory to authentic learning experiences.

TO APPLY:

- Complete NursingCAS application
- Official degree-bearing transcript(s)
- 3 professional letters of recommendation (one from your current employer or supervisor)
- I Resume and Essay
- I Admissions interview may be required

ELIGIBILITY:

- Nursing bachelor's degree from an NLN or AACN-CCNE accredited program
- Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.75 or above, with a grade of C or better in all nursing courses
- Completion of a statistics course with grade of C or better (must be taken prior to NR 602)
- Active RN license
- Current AHA Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- Two years of clinical practice as an RN (preferred)
