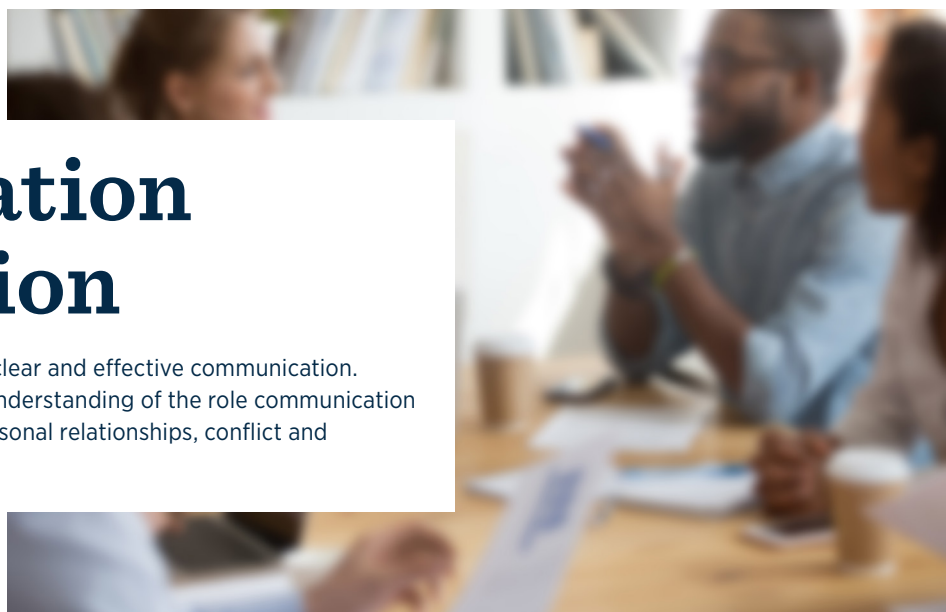


Communication Specialization
