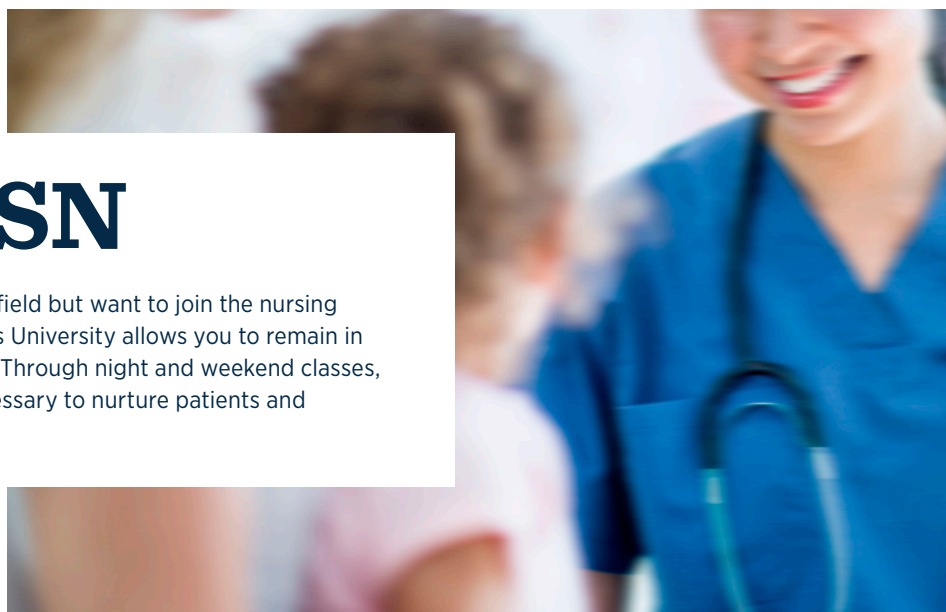


CHOICE BSN
