Service

- ♦ In Summer 2023, I modified MAPC 601: Graduate Transformation I: Writing and Research to make it more inclusive of Criminology (MSCR) students and to reflect a new edition of one of the textbooks.
- ♦ Starting in Spring 2023, I am serving on Manifest U, a university-wide committee seeking to develop credentials for DEI knowledge and skills.
- ♦ Starting in Fall 2020 and continuing indefinitely into the future, I serve on the Regis College Graduate Council, a committee composed of heads of graduate programs within the college.
- ♦ From Fall 2021 to Spring 2024, I am serving on the Regis University Academic Council.
- ♦ From Fall 2020 to Spring 2023, I served on the Academic Policies and Standards Committee, Regis University.
- ♦ In Spring 2023, Jerry Yocom and I once again delivered a Graduate Capstone Workshop to MA and MSCR students. The Director of Academic Internships and a former Chair of the IRB presented.
- ♦ Starting in the Spring of 2023, I have worked with the Philosophy Department on a long-term project to document the reading habits of our students, and develop appropriate pedagogy in response to our findings.
- ♦ Starting in 2022, I have worked with Dr. Ted Zenzinger in the Philosophy Department to completely rewrite PL 482, newly titled "The Art of Argumentation," to satisfy requirements for Regis College's Pre-Law minor. This course will be taught in Spring 2024.
- ♦ In Summer and Fall 2022 and the beginning of 2023, I shepherded through Faculty Council, RUAC, the 4Cs (and etc.) a proposal to establish Academic Certificates for high school teachers that would certify them to teach concurrent enrollment courses at their high schools in the disciplines of English, Communication, and Psychology.
- ♦ In Fall 2022, I worked with Lecturer Jerry Yocom to develop and then facilitate a Graduate Capstone Workshop to help our graduate students prepare to write their Capstones.
- ♦ From Fall 2021 to Fall 2022, I served on a sub-committee of APSC dedicated to reconciling and synthesizing the instructions for writing Academic Unit Reviews from RUAC with the instructions from APSC itself. I was responsible for submitting the final draft to the committee, which I did in October of 2022.
- ♦ In Summer 2022, I served on the search committee for a new Criminology Lecturer.
- ♦ In Spring 2022, I worked with two other faculty to completely rewrite PL 360: Ethics.
- ♦ In Fall 2021, I mentored new faculty J'Lyn Chapman, Assistant Professor of Liberal Arts, Coordinator of the Creative Writing and Literature Specialization within the School for Professional Advancement's MA Program.
- ♦ In 2021, I once again led the Assessment process for SPA's MA program.

- ♦ In Fall 2020 and Spring 2021, I served on the search committee for a new faculty member to head the Creative Writing and Literature Specialization within SPA's MA Program.
- ♦ In 2020 and early 2021, I oversaw the creation of the 16-week, 6 credit hour MAPC/MSCR 695 Experiential Capstone course (also cross-listed with the undergraduate CAP 498). I have continued to revise the course since then. It is an inter-disciplinary course, intended for students in SPA's 6 MA Specializations and our MS students in Criminology. It is now offered every semester. This course is a complement to an internship or a service-learning experience in the student's field of interest, procured by the student him- or herself.
- ♦ In 2020 and early 2021, I created the 16-week, 6 credit hour MAPC/MSCR 693 Graduate Capstone course. It is an inter-disciplinary course, intended for students in SPA's 6 MA Specializations and our MS students in Criminology. This course is now offered every semester.
- ♦ In Fall 2020, I worked with the Academic Internship Office and the Center for Service-Learning to develop and offer the Experiential Education Capstone Preparatory Workshop to help our graduate students find relevant internship and service-learning opportunities.
- ♦ In Fall 2020, I mentored new affiliate faculty Melvin Sanchez, preparing him to teach MAPC 602: Ethics & Multiculturalism in particular (a SPA course).
- ♦ In 2020, I led other faculty in the assessment of the MA program in Liberal Arts, in the School for Professional Advancement at Regis University.
- ♦ In 2020, I substantially revised the course shell for MAPC 601: Graduate Transformation I: Writing and Research, a course required of MA students in the School for Professional Advancement at Regis University.
- ♦ In 2019 and 2020, working with Roberta Mancuso, I modified PL 437: Perspectives on the Meaning of Life, a standard upper-division and graduate-level course offered by SPA, so that it incorporates content from positive psychology and social psychology. The title for this course is now "Happiness and the Meaning of Life."
- ♦ In the first few months of 2019, I substantially modified the online course shell for PL 225: Thinking Critically, Living Creatively, a core course for undergraduates throughout the School for Professional Advancement at Regis University.
- ♦ On August 15, 2018, I served on a faculty panel for the New Faculty Onboarding and Orientation, hosted by the Center for Excellence and Teaching in Learning, Office of the Provost, Regis University.
- ♦ In the first half of 2018, I redesigned the online course shell for MAPC 602: Ethics and Multiculturalism, a course required of MA students in the School for Professional Advancement at Regis University.
- ♦ From early in 2016 to the end of 2018, I took part in the creation and implementation of an assessment of the Introduction to Philosophy course offered at CCD.
- ♦ In the academic year 2014-2015, I worked with a committee at MSUD to alter Phi 1110: Language, Logic, and Persuasion so that it could be added to the General Studies Program. The course was finally added to General Studies in Fall 2017.
- ♦ At the end of 2013, I took part in a review of Student Learning Objectives for the General Studies Program at MSUD; I took part in another review at the end of 2014.

External Service

♦ On December 2, 2022, I taught lessons on self-awareness, particularly awareness of personal strengths, on a volunteer basis to students at Arrupe Jesuit High School; Denver, CO.

- ♦ On January 21, 2022, I assisted students with the revision of their resumes on a volunteer basis as part of a resume workshop at Arrupe Jesuit High School; Denver, CO.
- ♦ On September 21, 2021, I facilitated lessons on Microsoft Excel for students at Arrupe Jesuit High School on a volunteer basis; Denver, CO.

Professional Development

- ♦ In May of 2023, I served as an Ignatian Fellow again—participating in a specially designed week-long follow-up to the previous workshop. We focused especially on the role of justice in Jesuit education and pedagogy.
- ♦ In April of 2023, I completed the Colorado Department of Corrections' CTI (Correctional Training Institute) training, a requirement to teach for the Virtual Inside/Out Program.
- ♦ Throughout 2023, I have attended various workshops and webinars on AI's proper role in education, hosted by the *Chronicle for Higher Education*, the *Wall Street Journal*, and Macmillan Learning.
- ♦ In January of 2023, I participated in a Title IX Training with the rest of SPA faculty and staff.
- ♦ In May of 2022, I served as an Ignatian Fellow–this entailed my participation in a week-long intensive workshop on Ignatian spirituality and pedagogy.
- On May 14 and 15, 2022, I attended the silent retreat at the Sacred Heart Retreat House.
- ♦ During the 2021-22 academic year, I attended meetings for the Manresa experience at Regis University, a series of reflections and discussions that provided me with a substantial introduction to Ignatian thinking and values.
- ♦ I regularly attended SPA's own Professional Development Workshops, offered more or less monthly, on various topics, from June of 2020 to the end of 2022. Each workshop lasted about an hour.
- ♦ From Fall 2020 to Spring 2021, I was mentored by Ling Thompson of Instructional Design and Technology, Regis University. Our mentorship focused on online course development.
- ♦ In May of 2021, I completed CITI training on human subjects research in the social sciences to better understand which projects might need IRB review in the Graduate Capstone course.
- ♦ From August 3 to 7, 2020, I attended the Distance Teaching & Learning Conference, hosted by University of Wisconsin, Madison.
- ♦ From 2016 to 2020, I regularly participated in the CU Succeed Summer Faculty Conference, which always included sessions on pedagogy. I occasionally led sessions on different topics.
- ♦ On June 15, 2020, I attended Instructional Design and Technology's Faculty Engagement Workshop, Regis University.
- ♦ On May 28, 2020, I attended the following two sessions at Instructional Design and Technology's Zoom conference: "Co-Teaching tips and tricks in an online synchronous learning environment" and "Flexible learning with Zoom."
- ♦ On May 27 and May 29, 2020, I attended the following "fall planning sessions," offered by the Dean's Office at Regis College: "Making Your Online Discussion More Intentional and Manageable," "What's Possible in the Regis Digital Learning Ecosystem?" and "Flipped Classroom Concepts and Planning."
- ♦ On January 27, 2020, I participated in a 4-hour Inclusivity Training at Regis University, hosted by the Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusive Excellence.
- ♦ From Fall 2016 to Fall 2018, I attended Fall Orientation for Arts & Humanities faculty at Community College of Denver. These orientations consistently included sessions on pedagogy.

- ♦ On August 16, 2018, I participated in the All-Faculty Teaching Institute, hosted by the Center for Excellence and Teaching in Learning, Office of the Provost, Regis University.
