

M.Ed. ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

Our Teacher Education program is based on the philosophy that learning to be a teacher is best accomplished when an understanding of theory and practice is balanced by the knowledge gained through diverse experience in schools. Foundational courses will introduce you to theories in education. Your professional methods sequence courses will emphasize field placement and experiential learning and your student teaching semester will be your final culmination in applying what you have learned.

MASTER'S DEGREE WITH LICENSURE

8-week courses delivered online, blended and on-campus

Total Licensure Requirements (46 credit hours)

- ▶ The MEd Elementary Education Program is designed for those seeking initial licensure in the state of Colorado to teach grades K-6. Courses are offered online and on-campus with flexible scheduling to accommodate full-time and part-time students.
- ▶ Courses prepare students for working within the general education classroom that is inclusive of a special education population.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ To qualify for student teaching and licensure, students must pass required Praxis II exams prior to applying to student teach.
- ▶ Student teaching requires full time enrollment in the program and must be completed at an accredited K-6 institution within the state.
- ▶ A total of 200 field hours must be completed prior to student teaching. Student should expect to complete 1-4 field hours per week while enrolled in the program.
