Rural and underserved communities are in need of greater numbers of primary health care providers. Regis University's FNP for Rural and Underserved Communities is a low-residency program specifically designed to meet this need. The FNP for Rural and Underserved Communities will focus on the unique needs of rural and vulnerable populations from the perspective of rural nursing theories and content while incorporating the Regis University mission and Jesuit values.

PERKS OF THIS LOW-RESIDENCY PROGRAM:

- ▶ Same coursework as traditional campus-based FNP students.
- ▶ Five on-campus intensives offered throughout the program.
- ▶ Designated faculty coordinator to assist students in meeting personal goals, curriculum objectives and successfully completing the Master of Science in Nursing graduate program requirements.
- ▶ Classes will be offered in virtual classrooms in real time via video conferencing software as well as online via our online learning platform.
- ▶ Clinical practicums can be completed in rural areas with preceptors from local health care facilities and clinics.
