

MASTER OF ARTS IN MARRIAGE & FAMILY THERAPY

DEGREE PROGRAM

This degree prepares students to provide professional therapy based on in-depth research and the theory that mental health and family issues are best treated in a systemic and relational context. The program provides students with hands-on training through six credit hours of practicum completed at the Regis Center for Counseling and Family Therapy and essential clinical experience through three semesters of supervised internships at local mental health agencies. The Master of Arts in Marriage and Family Therapy program curriculum is accredited by COAMFTE.
