SCHEDULE OVERVIEW

Courses are offered Monday – Friday, during the day for the fall and spring semester the first three years. In the fourth year, students go year-round. Classes are held at our north west Denver, Colorado campus location.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ 72 or more undergraduate credit hours prior to matriculation
- ▶ Submission of PharmCAS application
- ▶ Official PCAT scores
- ▶ Recommended Math/Science GPA of 2.50 or above
- ▶ Required grade of C- or better in prerequisites
- ▶ One letter of recommendation
- ▶ On campus interview

APPLICATION PROCESS

Submit all required materials directly to PharmCAS at pharmcas.org, to include:

- ▶ All official college transcripts
- ▶ Official PCAT scores
- ▶ One letter of recommendation
- ▶ Application essay and supplemental questions

IMPORTANT DATES

- ▶ Application opens: Mid-July
- ▶ Early decision deadline: Early September
- ▶ Priority deadline: October 15
- ▶ Final deadline: March 1

Initial screening of PharmCAS applications is performed by the Office of Admissions. Screening is based on selection criteria designed by the School of Pharmacy faculty. Candidates are invited to interview on campus from October - March based on their qualifications.

These settings often afford the opportunity to interact with diverse and multicultural patients, promoting an appreciation for different cultures and perspectives. Students get the opportunity to begin their Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences (IPPEs) in the second semester of their very first year.
